### **FANMKAD**

Haiti (2021-2025)

An initiative aimed at reducing gender inequalities that prevent women and adolescent girls from accessing sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) services.

### **PRISMA and PRISMA 2**

Haiti (2011-2016 and 2017-2023)

Original actions aimed at ensuring better quality health care and management in maternal and child health.

### **PROMAVI**

Bolivia (2016-2022)

A multisectoral initiative that contributed to improving the living conditions of rural Bolivian families, particularly those of women, youth, and children.

### **PALIH y PALIH 2**

Haiti (2002-2011)

These AIDS response initiatives provided nearly one million people with access to quality STI and HIV prevention services, and awareness raising activities on gender-based violence (GBV).

## Africa

### **FAMS**

DR Congo (2024-2030)

Through an inclusive approach, FAMS aims to transform the living conditions of Congolese women by strengthening their agency and SRHR services.

### **ECOLLECTIF**

DR Congo (2023-2025)

In partnership with Ecosolaris and the Government of Quebec, ECollectif offers sustainable and ecological solutions to energy supply problems in Kinshasa's health facilities.

### **PLURIELLES**

Benin, Burkina Faso, Mali (2021-2027)

Using a unique multisectoral approach, PLURIELLES aims to increase the exercise of health rights by vulnerable and marginalized women and adolescent girls.

### **CLEFS and SIGUIDA KENEYA**

Mali (2020-2025)

Complementary projects relying on interdisciplinary expertise and community action to improve SRHR for Malian women.

### **BECEYA**

Mali (2015-2020)

An initiative of major importance that aims to improve the environment of care in over 128 health centers across 3 regions of Mali.

### **PASSKIN and ASSK**

DR Congo (2012-2017 and 2018-2024)

Two initiatives developed to improve access to primary healthcare, in particular to sexual and reproductive health services in the province of Kinshasa.

### **PASÉi, WARDS and REDISSE**

Sub-Saharan Africa (1991-2011, 2014-2017 and 2017-2024)

These projects contributed to strengthening Integrated Disease Surveillance and Response in 17 countries, notably through the establishment of Centers for Epidemiological Surveillance (CES).

### **SIDA 1, 2 and 3**

West Africa (1990-2006)

These pillar projects of Santé Monde contributed to the fight against STIs and AIDS in 23 countries. The effectiveness of our strategies earned us the designation of International Best Practices by UNAIDS in 2000.
